The office has been receiving a number of complaints regarding loose dogs running through the subdivision and owners of dogs not picking up after their pets.

As a reminder to all owners and renters, as per Yavapai County Ordinance Number 2000-3, pets must be on a leash and attended to when out of the confines of your yard. Excessive barking and stray dogs should be reported to Yavapai County Animal Control at 928-771-3260. Yavapai County Ordinance number 1997-2 requires all owners of dogs carry a baggie and clean up after your pet when it is outside of your yard. This ordinance also requires that you keep your yard clean of feces as well. Accumulation of feces creates a breeding place for flies and other undesirable insects which can create a serious health problem.

The POA and your neighbors thank you for keeping your dog on a leash, picking up after your dog and controlling excessive barking.

A Taste of Wine





March March March - I love the month of March. Days are getting longer and Springtime is right around the corner. Also, corned beef usually goes on sale at the grocery store so I stock up on it. I make corned beef and cabbage in the

crock pot several times throughout the year. It is so easy to make, produces a wonderful aroma in the house, and tastes absolutely scrumptious. So, today's big question is "What wine goes best with Corned Beef and Cabbage?"

Interestingly, the same wines that go with Thanksgiving dinner also go with corned beef and cabbage. If you prefer red, go with Beaujolais, Grenache, or a light pinot noir. The reasoning is that the salty-fatty yumminess typical of corned beef and the usual bay leaf and peppercorn flavoring are balanced by the light and fruity flavors of these red wines. The light reds have some acidity to offset the fat. Staying away from a heavy red wine such as Cabernet Sauvignon is a good idea because the tannins will not pair well with the saltiness of this meal and will

cause a bitter aftertaste. The same is true on the white side. A light Pinot Gris or most any Spanish or Italian wine will tone down the salty and fatty tastes and leave plenty of room in your tummy for seconds.

My wine of choice this year is going to be a 2017 Chateau De Pizay Beaujolais. It is a dark garnet-purple wine with a very youthful nose, held back at first, with underlying crushed dark berries and flinty overtones. The taste is clean and balanced and possesses an attractive texture. This light-weight red has a relatively tender structure with fine acidity. I am counting the days until Saint Patrick's Day, or the Feast of Saint Patrick, is a celebration in honor of the patron saint of Ireland, Saint Patrick. Septic 101: Homeowner Education Course

On February 5, JT's Septic held a Septic 101: Homeowner Education course, in partnership with Yavapai County's Environmental Services Department, at the POA Building for over 30 residents- a big thank you to all who attended! If you missed this course, please check the PCC News Local Events calendar for future dates.

A quick reminder of the do's and don'ts of living on septic:

It is OK to put the following down your drain: household cleaners in reasonable amounts, disinfectants, bleach in reasonable amounts, small food particles (through a dishwasher, garbage disposal or down the sink drain), enzymes and/ or yeast products, and reasonable amounts of toilet tissue.

JT's receives a lot of questions regarding the type of toilet tissue approved for septic systems- a simple test you can do at home: place the tissue you are using in a glass or bottle of water overnight. Is the paper mostly or fully dissolved in the morning? If so, you're good to go! If not, you may want to look into a brand that passes the water test.

It is NOT OK to put the following down your drain:

Coffee grounds, dental floss, disposable diapers, cat box litter, cigarette butts, plastics, facial tissue, paper towels, fabric softener and especially not wet wipes or feminine hygiene products or cooking oil and grease. Things like





coffee grounds and cat litter do not break down in your septic tank and will require your tank to be pumped on a more frequent basis. Wet wipes and hygiene products can get caught along with solids in your inlet pipe (which leads from your house to your tank) causing clogs and possibly backups into your household fixtures. Grease and fabric softener clog sewer pipes and form a thick coating along the pipes which does not allow solids and paper to travel smoothly to your tank.

The best think you can do for your system is have your tank pumped and/or serviced frequently by a reliable service provider.

It is important to know your system

Do you have a filter that requires annual cleaning? Do you have sewer cleanouts in case your inlet pipe has a clog? Do you know the last time your tank was pumped and where your system is located?? JT's can help with all of that!

The Sky This Month



Welcome to our night-time sky. Please enjoy this month's tidbits of knowledge. We are lucky to live in a dark-sky area where the heavens can shine through. I hope you enjoy the sky and perhaps learn a thing or two. Happy star gazing!

Who Needs a Compass? – A magical alignment occurs on March 20.

The Earth's axis aligns with the ecliptic, which is the plane of rotation around the Sun. In the northern hemisphere, prior to March 20, the Sun rises south of due East in the morning and sets south of due West in the evening. After March 20, the Sun rises north of due East and sets north of due West. So, what happens on March 20? The Sun rises exactly due East and sets exactly due West! This occurs everywhere on Earth. If you want to know exactly where East and West are, you only need to wait for the Spring or Autumnal equinox. Then, just look outside and observe where the Sun rises or sets.

Ancient people observed the movement of the Sun throughout the year and built solar markers to identify the equinoxes and solstices. Depending on where the Sun rose or set, the time of year could be determined, just like a sundial shows the time of the day. A perfect example of a solar

calendar is Stonehenge in the UK. The people who built Stonehenge observed the Sun's movement over years and then constructed the monument to mark those locations.

Where Does the Moon Rise? – If you marked the location of due East on the morning of the 20th, you can see where the Moon rises in relation to due East. At sunset on March 20, a full Supermoon will rise in the East, but it will not rise due East. This is because the Moon follows its own course around the solar system. Contrary to many other planetary moons, our Moon is roughly aligned with the ecliptic instead of the Earth's equator. The Moon's plane of rotation is inclined roughly 5 degrees from the ecliptic. Over an 18.6-year cycle, the Moon's declination is either added to or subtracted from the Earth's 23.5-degree declination. The Moon's location can thus change from +/- 18.5 degrees to +/- 28.5 degrees depending on the time of the 18.6-year cycle and the time of the season. In addition, the Moon rotates around the Earth once every 27.2 days. Throwing that into the mix, it's not trivial to figure out exactly where the Moon will rise or set on any given day. However, in general, the Moon will rise and set opposite to where the Sun rises and sets. In the winter, the Moon will tend to rise in the Southeast and set in the Southwest. In the summer, the Moon will tend to rise in the Northeast and set in the Northwest.

The Herbalist - Chocolate: Food of the Gods

I'm writing this article on Valentine's evening while eating a bit of dark chocolate. I had an epiphany when trying to decide which herb to discuss this month. Should it be about Spring greens? One of my favorite flowers? Well, it's cold out and snow is still in our forecast so I decided that I'd write about everyone's favorite food, Chocolate. What? No herbs this month?

Well, cocao does grow on trees as berries so I think that counts for me.

Not only is chocolate loved all over the world, it has many health benefits that certainly qualify it as a healer. How many things in life are delicious and good for you? Let's dig in to what makes this berry so amazing. Cocao is found worldwide but the beans originate near the equator. The Mayans called it Cacao, meaning food of the gods, and used it as currency, locally and with traders who first brought it to Spain. Early world travelers then brought it to their homes and now, it is ubiquitous. Early drinkers of this liquid gold were certainly drinking something other than what we now know as cocoa. The beans are bitter, so over time, chocolate has become sweeter to accommodate more modern tastes. The modern processing has also removed so many of the health benefits that I look for cocoa in it's darkest and purest form. Warning, 80% cacao is not for everyone but I love it. I actually used to eat my mom's unsweetened baking chocolate when I was a kid. My mom was horrified.

Buying raw, organic cocao is the best way to reap its benefits, so look at labels. First, it is loaded with antioxidants, so much so that you'd have to eat 40 times more blueberries to get that level of antioxidants. Antioxidants help absorb free radicals, those nasty cellular destroyers.

Cacao is also loaded with magnesium and calcium. Helping bones remain more dense and muscles to be relaxed, including coronary muscles making this delicious treat good for your heart. Cocao also has the blood thinning qualities a daily aspirin can provide. Now here is my favorite part. Cocao is a precursor for serotonin, our feel-good hormone. Our body has serotonin receptors in the digestive tract so when we eat chocolate, we're feeding ourselves a pure form of some happiness. Not many herbs have that kind of immediate soothing power.

To get the best benefits from that steaming cup of goodness, start out with the best cocao, add milk or milk substitute of your choice, heat, stir and blend. Add your choice of sweetener but try only putting in around half of what you would normally use. Stir. Now add a pinch of cayenne, a few pinches of cinnamon or put a cinnamon stick in your mug. Now sip. It's wonderful isn't it?

Why Eyes Look Red in Photos

The "red-eye effect" occurs when a camera captures light reflecting from the retina at the back of the subject's eye when a flash is used at night and in dim lighting.

Light rays travel through the cornea and pupil of the eye to focus on the retina, a layer of light-detecting cells at the back of the eye. From here, the retina converts the light rays into electronic pulses that travel along the optic nerve to the brain to create visual images.

In fact the eye works very similar to the way a camera does. Light enters the clear covering of the eye, like the glass of a camera lens, and the pupil controls the amount of light that travels through the eye, like a camera aperture. The retina captures the incoming light and sends a record of it to the brain, like camera film.

When a camera flash goes off, the pupils of the subjects eyes don't have time to constrict to reduce the amount of light entering their eyes. Therefore a large burst of light reaches their retinas, reflects back and is captured on film. The eyes look red in photos due to the rich blood supply of the choroid (a layer of con-

nective tissue at the back of the eye that nourishes the retina) which gives the retina its normal red color.

There are several ways to reduce the "red-eye effect"

- 1. Tell your subjects not to look directly at the camera which avoids the direct angle flash.
- 2. Make the room brighter. The darker the environment, the more dilated the subjects pupils become which increases the likelihood of red eye effect.
- 3. Turn on the anti-red-eye function on your camera. Most cameras and smart phones have this feature. This function emits shorts flashes of light in quick succession before the camera actually takes the picture, giving the subjects pupils time to constrict.
- 4. Make the flash and lens further apart if you have an external flash attachment.

If a family member or friend seems to always have just one eye that shows red or reflects the light, that could be a sign of an eye disorder and they should see their

optometrist for a thorough eye exam.



Jewelry Reflections



A Tale of Earrings

Earrings have been one of the principle forms of jewelry throughout history. They serve as symbols of cultural or tribal identity, markers of age, rank or marital status, or provide protective

powers.

Among the oldest earrings are crescent-shaped gold hoops worn by Sumerian women in 2500 BC. Around 1000 BC earrings started to be embellished with clusters of beads, twisted wire and pendants.

Then in the first century AD, the Romans introduced a new earring style: a disk or pendant mounted on a S hook. These styles became more lavish with the addition of colored stones and pearls.

Around 330, the center of influence moved from Rome to Byzantium (Constantinople) and earring styles changed again. Favored styles included hoops with multiple pearl pendants hung on chains and crescent-shaped earrings of gold filigree.

Between the eleventh and sixteenth centuries in Europe, earrings all but disappeared as hair and clothing styles covered the ear. However, by the late seventeenth century earrings once again became an essential element of dress. Earrings during this period were so heavy they had small rings attached so the wearer could tie them to her hair and take some of the weight off her ears. These heavy styles disappeared by

the end of the eighteenth century as fashions became simpler.

Throughout the nineteenth century, designs ranged from long drop earrings to small single-stone and cluster earrings. Cameos and jewelry made of cut steel, seed pearls, coral and jet were popular. With the opening of the South African diamond fields in the 1860's and the introduction of better cutting and polishing methods, diamond solitaires became the most fashionable earrings.





What do I do when my Home Loan is Due?

Most Americans need a home loan to finance the purchase of real estate. Many of those home owners will have owned less than a handful of homes throughout their life time. A good portion of those home owners will pass on with a loan against the property. It's important to understand the difference between "when my FORWARD mortgage is due" and "when my REVERSE mortgage is due." This is a topic that can be discussed from many different angles. For the purpose of this article I will limit my focus to the options the heir has when they are bequeathed real estate.

When you get a home loan in Arizona (Forward or Reverse) two things are happening. You (the home owner) is given a loan (called The Note) and the beneficiary (Lender) is being given a security instrument (called a Deed of Trust). These two documents together create a lien on your property. This applies to both a Forward and Reverse mortgage.

It is important to understand both the relationship between the two documents (ie, the Note and Deed of Trust) and the parties involved in the Deed of Trust. Simply put the Note defines the terms of your "promise to pay." This document outlines the interest rate, term of the loan, the date the loan is due, whether the loan is fixed or adjustable, conventional or government, for a primary residence or an investment property. The Deed of Trust, on the other hand, first establishes a relationship between three parties, the Trustor (Homeowner/Borrower), the Beneficiary (Lender) and the Trustee (Title Company).

In a nut shell, the Deed of Trust says that the Lender and Homeowner have agreed to allow the Title Company the power to collect on the Note when it becomes due.

Let's begin with the Forward loan. Certainly the heir can continue to make the mortgage payments. Many people are not in a position to take on extra debt, so we will assume the heir has contacted the lender to notify them of the home owner's death. The heir of the property now has a few options. 1.) They can pay the loan off in full. 2.) They can refinance the loan. 3.) They can sell the house and retain the proceeds or if the loan balance exceeds the value. 4.) They allow the bank to foreclose.

In the event the bank has to foreclose, the heir may be at risk of also inheriting the lenders' loss. I am not an attorney nor in a position to give advice, so if you find yourself in this situation, consult a Real Estate Attorney immediately.

How a Reverse loan is paid back is quite different than the Forward. Again, the same documents and relationships exist as mentioned above whereby the Deed of Trust defines how the Trustee can collect the debt. The heir of the property has similar options. They can 1.) Pay the loan off in full. 2. Refinance the loan. 3. Sell the house or 4.) Surrender the Deed in Lieu of Foreclosure. If the lender incurs a loss because the sale price of the home was less than the loan amount, the heir has ZERO liability.

Many of us think of a home as an asset and want to leave what we have enjoyed to someone we love. It's important to understand the differences between a forward paying loan and a reverse loan so that the asset you leave your heir doesn't become a liability to them.




