## PCC POA BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING



The following minutes will be approved subject to corrections at the next Board of Directors meeting.

#### DATE & TIME:

Pursuant to Section 7.0 of the POA Bylaws, a regular Board meeting was held on April 10, 2024 at 6:00 PM at the Property Owners Association Activity Center.

#### **OFFICERS AND QUORUM:**

The President, Bob Heise, opened the meeting and Secretary PJ Bradfield took minutes. The following additional Board Members were present: Al Zielinski, Jennifer Lynch, Gracelyn Palmer, Maddy Childers and Joe Pichitino. Jim Sexton was absent.

#### **MINUTES:**

Al Zielinski motioned to approve the January 10, 2024 Board of Directors Meeting and Organizational Meeting minutes without reading; Joe Pichitino 2nd, all approved. (Note: There were no meetings in February or March)

#### **OFFICE MANAGER'S REPORT:** None

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

Architectural: Permits for one shed, one fence and one deck were approved. The property at 1111 Quail Ridge Drive (the White Mansion) is not part of the POA jurisdiction. The wall between ReMax Realty and Vallejo Dental remains pending.

Budget & Finance: Jennifer reported Account Balances - Checking: \$102,523.08; Reserve: \$75,033.27. She also noted \$15,600 income from escrow fees; \$2,500 remains outstanding for annual dues. Jennifer also would like to schedule the 2025 Budget Preparation Meeting for August

Building & Common Areas: Al reported Cintas performed the annual Fire Safety inspection: \$237.48; Replaced the American Flag: \$50.99; Premier Carpet cleaning: \$334; A/C filters changed on April 1; LED lights: \$52.25. Titan Landscaping trimmed trees February 29.

Enforcement & Safety: Maddy and PJ inspect for violations monthly.

Community Events & Relations: The Country Club Park ribbon cutting was March 22. A survey could be created to see what park amenities homeowners wish to include; Reservations can be made for park use. Shrubs will be planted on the west end of the park.

Nominating Committee: Chris Baum will work with Marge on the 2024 elections.

#### **UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**

Reserve Study: Al reported he sent final edits to Nick Vocke in January and emailed out the final Reserve Study February 5th to the Board. Al motioned to accept the Reserve Study, Jennifer 2nd - All approved.

Expense/Spending Policy: Jennifer presented the Expense/Spending Policy that was required by the By-Laws. The Policy aims for better checks and balances. Board-approved services may be directly processed for payment by the Manager, as well as recurring expenses, such as utilities, that are approved by the Board through the annual budget process; any item that exceeds that budget by 25% will be highlighted to the Board through the monthly financial review process. Board approval is also required for expenditures on new projects or capital assets and any expenditures from the Reserve Account. Jennifer motioned to approve. Al seconded - All approved.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Sequoia Pruning: Jonny's Tree & Dandscaping bid \$825. Jennifer motioned, Al second - All approved.

Sequoia Irrigation: Titan Landscape bid \$640 to extend irrigation, add mulch & amp; rock under the Sequoia. Motioned by Al, Jennifer second - All approved.

Board Appointment: Chris Baum volunteered to fill the vacant Director position. Motioned by Al, seconded by PJ - All approved.

Change Date & Time of Board Meetings: Jennifer proposed changing the date and time of Board meetings to the 1st Wednesday of the month at 2:00 pm. This will allow the Office Manager (Marge) to attend meetings. The General Membership Meeting in October and the Annual Meeting in December will remain the same. Motioned by Al, seconded by Jennifer - All approved.

Assessment Increase 2025: Jennifer proposed increasing the 2025 Annual Assessment/Dues by \$5; from \$57 to \$62. The recent Reserve Study recommended the increase and indicated the POA should have \$207,550 in reserves, yet we have \$75,000. Jennifer motioned, Al seconded - All approved.

Next Board Meeting will be May 1 at 2:00 p.m. with Marge the Office Manager, attending.

## **How to Preserve Your Family History For Future Generations**

In previous issues of PCCNews, I discussed how to organize your family's story to create a book; scanning images for your book; writing your family's story; and working with a book designer. The last step is preparing your book for printing.

Your book needs to be proofread thoroughly. Not once, but many times. You may want a friend or relative to read it too. It's very difficult to proofread your own writing. Fresh eyes are most helpful. Every time you proof it, you'll see things you missed previously. I worked with an author who proofed the book eleven times and found something to correct each time! You must proofread the text, family charts, captions, etc.

Changes can affect the way the text flows in the book. That's why it's necessary to proofread the pages with the changes as well as the pages before and afterwards. The more you read it, the more typos or mistakes you'll find, even though you proofread the individual

The designer needs this information to complete the artwork for the cover's front, back and spine. The printer needs the page count and the book quantity to estimate printing costs.



## **Jewelry Reflections**



## Gems Are Not Just for Jewelry

When we think of gems, we usually think of jewelry, but gems are used in many other ways. In fact, the majority of mined gems are used

in applications other than jewelry. Here are just a few of their non-jewelry uses.

Hematite is an iron oxide and the most important iron ore being 70% iron. Powdered hematite is called red ocher and is used as a pigment. Purified, ground hematite is called rouge and is used to polish plate glass and jewelry.

Corundum is aluminum oxide. It is called ruby when red and sapphire when other colors. Regardless of color, corundum is used as an abrasive for grinding glass and polishing metal. It is made into sandpapers and grinding wheels.

Fluorite is calcium fluoride. It is used as a flux in the manufacturing of steel and as a catalyst in the manufacture of high-octane fuels. Fluorite plays a large part in the creation of glazed tiles and opalescent glass. It is a source of fluorine which is used for the fluoridation of water and in Teflon coatings.





**Malachite** is green copper carbonate hydroxide. It was ground and used as eye paint in ancient times possibly to ward off the evil eye. It was also used as the green pigment in wall paintings dating back to the 15th century BC.

**Kyanite** is the major raw material for the aluminum silicate mullite which is used in spark plugs and heatresistant porcelains.

Lazurite is the main component of lapis lazuli and gives it its deep blue color. Powdered lapis was used for hundreds of years to make the pigment ultramarine. And it was probably one of the first eye shadows.

Petalite, lithium aluminum silicate, is an important source of lithium. Its high chemical activity makes possible the tiny batteries used in pacemakers and other small devices.

These are just some of the reasons I find gemstones so fascinating and why I enjoy learning about all the uses for gems. Of course, my favorite use is in my jewelry.

## **Using Future Income to Qualify for a Home Loan**

Would it surprise you to know that you can use expected future income to qualify for a home purchase or to refinance your existing home? In the last couple of years both conventional loans (ie, Fannie Mae; Freddie Mac) as well as government loans (ie, FHA, VA & USDA) have expanded the types of future incomes that can be used to qualify for a home purchase, today.

Expected future income refers to income from costof-living adjustments, performance raises [from an existing job], a new job or retirement. The key piece of the puzzle is that the income must be received within 60 days of the loan closing. The documentation to support the future income will vary based on the type of income you plan to use.

For example if you were changing employers and wanted to close on a home purchase prior to starting the new job, the income for the new employer could be used. A letter from your future employer stating your position, your pay structure and start date would need to be provided at the time of application. This letter will be used to support your qualifying income. Within 5 days of closing on the loan, the employer will be contacted to confirm the details of that letter and assuming nothing has changed, the loan will close.

rental income for investment property purchases.

Say you plan to buy a single family home to rent out. Often times a buyer hasn't lined up a renter prior to closing on the purchase of the home. In this case, the buyer is able to use 75% of the average market rent for the area as income to help qualify for the purchase. The market rent is documented by the appraiser when they complete the appraisal report.

There are many more types of future income that can be used when purchasing a home or refinancing

your existing home such as a new draw from a qualified retirement account or an annuity. It's important to provide as much documentation regarding future income as possible at the time of application because not all mortgage lenders and institutional banks follow these rules. Sometimes they require additional information above and beyond the standard, making it more difficult to qualify.
